Scope and Content Note

The series contains project files, equipment grant files, and administrative records of the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) which provides funds to private non-profit programs to alleviate hunger among target populations in New York State. Project files include grant proposals, contracts, budgets, reports, correspondence, and review records for about 50 ongoing projects.

One-time equipment purchase files include contracts and agreements for funding provided to food pantries, soup kitchens, and similar programs for purchase of equipment. Administrative files include correspondence, minutes, reports, internal memoranda, and summary statistics on the program.

The series contains information on soup kitchens and food pantries and their destitute and homeless clientele. The records document the problems of malnourished and homeless individuals and society's response to this problem, and as such they provide rare documentation on the homeless population and programs that serve them.
