# **Scope and Content Note**

Records include correspondence, submission packets, drafts of legislation, discussion papers and revised drafts of initial proposals (e.g., for operation of the grants component of the proposed Records Management Improvement Fund), and internal memoranda summarizing changes recommended by the Local Government Records Advisory Council. Issues include problems with emergency adoption of local government management rules; procedural questions on formulating, scheduling and presenting legislation; and assessments of issues raised by public comment.
