Exactly when the index was compiled is unclear, but it would appear to be after 1923, since the cover of the volumes are stamped "Department of Public Works."

Maps indexed in volume one date between 1846-1900, with the bulk dating from 1890-1900. Maps indexed in volume two date between 1901 and 1912.
