# **Scope and Content Note**

This series consists of a card file index to part of Series B0561, State Museum Director's, State Geologist's, and State Paleontologist's Correspondence Files. Cards predominantly index correspondence between James Hall and other geologists and paleontologists during Hall's lengthy career with the State Museum and other institutions. Cards list correspondent's name, date of correspondence, and place where correspondence originated. While most entries refer to letters received by Hall, those marked "from Hall" refer to copies of outgoing correspondence

This index was created circa 1915 by Noah T. Clarke, for the private use of John M. Clarke in the preparation of a biographical work on James Hall. It is unclear when the index was placed in the custody of the New York State Museum. Upon transfer from the State Library to the State Archives in 1978, the index was originally accessioned as part of series B0561-78. During 2002 the index was discretely accessioned as series B1815.
