It contains information about the office's history, mission, and organizational structure; press releases (2004-2007); annual reports (2003-2007); and welfare fraud report forms.

B2195-09: This accretion consists of a January 12, 2009 copy of the Office of the Welfare Inspector General website. This copy, which was produced in anticipation of the proposed merger of the Office of the Welfare Inspector General and the Office of the Medicaid Inspector General, contains information about the office's history, mission, and organizational structure; press releases (2004-2007); annual reports (2003-2007); and welfare fraud report forms.

B2195-10: This accretion consists of a copy of the Office of the Welfare Inspector General website produced on December 23, 2010, shortly before Governor David A. Paterson (2008-2010) left office. It contains information about the office's history, mission, and organizational structure; press releases (2008-2010); reports and referrals (2002-2010); and information about reporting welfare fraud.

B2195-17: This accretion consists of a copy of the Office of the Welfare Inspector General site produced on January 24, 2017. It contains information about the office's history, mission, and organizational structure; press releases (2013-2015); reports and referrals (2013-2014);

information about reporting welfare fraud; and instructions on how to submit a Freedom of Information Law (FOIL) request.
