The witnesses were Sir John Johnson, Patrick Langan, Joseph Chew, Timothy O'Brien, Richard Mandeville, all residents of Montreal or vicinity. The subject matter of their depositions was the last will, the business and official records, and the property of Sir William Johnson.
