Materials pertain to a wide range of organizations including New York State Courts, Division of Probation, Office of Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities, Jury System Management Advisory Committee, New York State Law Enforcement Council, Dept. of Correctional

Services, Division of Substance Abuse, Division of Criminal Justice Services, and various other commissions and Assembly task forces.

Material is primarily associated with criminal justice and substance abuse issues. Examples of topics include substance abuse programs, local assistance in crime prevention, probation supervision, organized crime, fingerprint retrieval, alternatives to incarceration, grand jury reform, the death penalty, use of deadly force, and judicial compensation.
